Nightlight® Christian Adoptions International Adoption Program Description Honduras







GENERAL INFORMATION

Honduras is a Central American country with Caribbean Sea coastlines to the north and the Pacific Ocean to the south. The Capital is Tegucigalpa; the main language is Spanish although native tribes speak their native languages.

Adoptions in Honduras are completed through a collaborative effort that includes a Honduran attorney working directly with the Honduran Central Authority called Dirección de Ninez, Adolescencia y Familia translation The Department of Children, Adolescents, and Family (DINAF), the government agency that authorizes all domestic and international adoptions. DINAF ensures that the child is eligible for adoption and no biological family members are willing and able to care for the child.

CHILDREN AVAILABLE

- Honduran children available for adoption range from 2 years of age to pre-teens.
- More boys than girls are available and families will need to be open to either gender.
- Children are either Caucasian or of Hispanic ancestry.

ELIGIBILITY TO ADOPT

- Married couples and single women may adopt from Honduras.
- Applicants must be between 25 and 60 and must be at least 15 years older than the child they wish to adopt.
- Married couples must be married a minimum of 3 years and Honduras will accept no more than 2 divorces per applicant.

PROCESS

- 1. Make application to Nightlight Christian Adoptions.
- 2. Complete all Nightlight application paperwork and a Hague adoption home study.
- 3. Prepare an I-800A application and be granted approval by the United State Citizenship & Immigration Service (USCIS). In the most basic terms, this process grants a pre-approval for you to bring an orphaned child into the U.S. as a citizen.
- 4. Gather documents which will go through a certification and authentication process to become your dossier. (We will help you through the certification and authentication process.) This step can be worked on concurrently with the Home Study.
- 5. Submit a letter of intent and your Dossier to DINAF through Nightlight's attorney.
- 6. Once your completed dossier is submitted to Honduras' Central Adoption Authority (DINAF), it will be evaluated by the General Secretary of DINAF. After the General Secretary's approval, your file is presented to the DINAF adoption committee who will match you with a child.
- 7. The matching process usually takes 24 months to 36 months after the dossier is submitted. The younger the child you wish to adopt, the longer the wait for a referral. The wait time is shortened if you are adopting a waiting child.
- 8. After you are given a match from DINAF, you will complete official referral review with Nightlight's Social Services Department
- 9. Upon acceptance of the referral, Nightlight will process and submit the I-800. You will be granted approval by USCIS. This process grants approval for the adoption to move forward and gives permission for the child to immigrate into the U.S.

- after the adoption is completed.
- 10. You will then be invited to travel to Honduras to meet with the social worker and psychologist at DINAF and to meet and bond with the child. This trip is approximately 7 10 days.
- 11. The attorney in Honduras will work with the U.S. Embassy, DINAF, and the court to assist in processing of your adoption.
- 12. The court process takes 2 to 3 months.
- 13. After the court process, a birth certificate and passport will be obtained and the adoption will be registered in Honduras.
- 14. You will then travel to Honduras to receive definitive custody of the child and request a VISA interview with the US Embassy. Finally, you will bring your child home. The trip will take approximately 2 weeks.
- 15. Please note that all timelines are estimates and may vary.

TRAVEL & ADOPTION

There are two trips required for adoptions from Honduras. The first trip is approximately 7-10 days. The second trip is typically 2 weeks in length. The attorney will pick you up from the airport, accompany you to all appointments, and accompany you to the airport at your departure.

POST ADOPTION

Within 30 days of your arrival home, you must have a home visit by your home study provider. Your first written report will be required 3 months after the child comes home. Additionally, your home study provider will prepare post-adoption reports and submit them to Nightlight each quarter in the first year you are home and twice per year in the 2nd year you arrive home. You will be required to submit self-reports 1 time per year until your child is 18 years of age. These reports include your child's developmental progress and pictures. This is a very serious commitment; Nightlight is committed to showing DINAF and birth families that children adopted by US citizens are healthy and well cared for. Compliance with post adoption reports is also required by Honduras. Therefore, Nightlight charges a fee to monitor and process these post adoption reports and also requires families to pay for the cost of the post adoption report in advance. There is also a fee for translation of the adoption reports and shipment of the apostilled post adoption reports that must be paid at the time of accepting a referral.

COSTS

The program fee for a Honduras adoption is \$13,500. Your additional costs will include home study, USCIS approval, notary & apostille fees, airfare, hotel, in country guide, and embassy fees as shown on the fee schedule. Your out-of-pocket expenses may further be reduced if you receive scholarships, grants or employer-provided adoption benefits. For additional fee information please see Exhibit A.

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Getting Started CHECKLIST

1. Fill out Application Documents

- Read and Sign the Consent to Release Confidential Information
- Read and sign the Privacy Practices
- Upload your family photo
- Pay the application fee

2. Complete your Orientation

Once we review and accept your Application materials, we will send you an acceptance letter via email. Shortly after that you will receive an invoice for the orientation phase and then begin your orientation with your adoption advisor.

3. Obtain a Home Study

- If you live in Nightlight's licensed area, we will perform your home study. Once your application is approved, your adoption advisor will notify you how to get started on your home study with one of our Nightlight offices.
- If you are out of Nightlight's licensed area, we will help you find a local agency.

The cost of operating an international adoption program is substantial and increasing with the additional compliance requirements under The Hague Convention on Inter-Country Adoption. The nature of international adoption makes it impossible to predict the exact costs you will incur, but we believe the estimates above are realistic. Although we strive to maintain a predictable fee schedule, unexpected increase in our costs may necessitate an increase in fees. Therefore, fees may beincreased upon 90-day notice.

Program fees are paid in phases and are non-refundable. Nightlight establishes a budget for costs each year based on the number of adoptions it estimates completing, as well as revenue from grants and donations. Based on these estimates, we establish program fees to cover the costs of attorneys, facilitators, social workers, insurance, and other costs we incur. Of course it would be prohibitive to allocate all of the costs (payroll, rent, insurance, supplies, travel, etc) to one adoption in one program.

A late fee of 12% annual (1% monthly) will be assessed for fees more than 30 days past due.
