## Nightlight<sup>®</sup> Christian Adoptions International Adoption Program Description India



### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The country of India, the largest region of the Indian Subcontinent, extends from the Himalayan Mountains in the north and south into the tropical reaches of the Indian Ocean. It's the most populous democratic country in the world (over 12 billion people) and certainly one of the most interesting. From Indian foods to modes of transportation to colorful clothing, and animals competing with autos on the roadways, India offers a unique perspective on life and the world. India consists of 29 states and New Delhi is the capitol.

### ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Our India program began in Missouri with Love Basket Adoptions in the early 1980's. Love Basket merged with Nightlight in 2015 and brought this wonderful program with them. We work directly with CARA (Central Adoption Resource Authority). We have a long history of successful placements through our India program. Through the years, this program has remained a consistent source of children for the adoptive families we serve.

### CHILDREN AVAILABLE

Children of all ages are available for adoption from India. More females and children over the age of 2 years tend to be available. Sibling groups and children with varying degrees of special needs are also available. In most cases, we see vast improvements in children with special needs once they are receiving proper medical care and living in a healthy environment.

### **ELIGIBILITY TO ADOPT**

India requires that, if married, couples must be married a minimum of 2 years (at the time of Home Study) and a couple with more than 2 children are not eligible unless pursuing a child with special needs. India requires that families keep birth order. Singles are eligible to adopt. The minimum age difference between the child and either of the adoptive parents should not be less than 25 years and the maximum composite age of both parents cannot be over 90 years (this requirement is more flexible if adopting a school age child). All parents should be physically, mentally and emotionally stable; financially capable; motivated to adopt, and should not have any life threatening medical conditions.

#### PROCESS

- Complete all Nightlight application paperwork and a Hague adoption home study.
- Prepare an I-800A application and be granted approval by the United State Citizenship & Immigration Service (USCIS). In the most basic terms, this process grants a pre-approval for you to bring an orphaned child into the U.S. as a citizen.
- Gather documents which will go through a certification and authentication process to become your dossier. (We will help you through the certification and authentication process.) This step can be worked on concurrently with the Home Study.
- Once your dossier is submitted to India, be matched by India's Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA) with a child meeting your preferences outlined in the Home Study. Have the child's medical and social information reviewed by a medical professional and, once you are committed, formally accept the child with CARA.

- Complete official referral review with Nightlight's Social Services Department
- Prepare an I-800 application and be granted approval by USCIS. This process grants approval for the adoption to move forward and gives permission for the child to immigrate into the U.S. with you as their sponsor.
- Send CARA and/or the orphanage documents as requested for court processing. Upon completion of court processing, the child's passport will be issued.
- Apply for a six month multiple entry tourist visa for India.
- Travel to India. You will pick up your child from their orphanage and travel to the U.S. Embassy in New Delhi for your medical/visa appointment to obtain an immigrant visa for your child to enter the United States. This trip takes an average of 7-10 days. Note: Some states in India will require a longer in country stay.
- Bring your child home from India!
- Complete post adoption reports as required by CARA.

### TRAVEL

There is one trip required for adoption from India. This trip will be to bring your child/ren home and is typically 7-10 days in length. Some states in India will require you to be present for court thus lengthening you're in country stay by several weeks. You will pick up the child and their documents from the orphanage and then travel to the U.S. Embassy in New Delhi where you will have your child evaluated at the medical clinic there and obtain their immigrant visa. Nightlight has an in-country representative that will accompany you to all appointments.

### POST ADOPTION

The total number and interval of post adoption reports/visits can vary by state in India but will be specified on your India court order. The most common is a total of 6 reports according to the following schedule: 1 month, 3 months, 6 months, 12 months, 18 months and 24 months from U.S. arrival. Nightlight will send these social worker reports, along with photos and citizenship information to the orphanage and CARA.

The program fee for India is \$15,750. Your additional costs will include home study, USCIS approval, notary & apostille fees, airfare, hotel, in country guide, and embassy fees as shown on the fee schedule. Your out-of-pocket expenses may further be reduced if you receive scholarships, grants or employer-provided adoption benefits. For additional fee information please see Exhibit A. ### 1. Fill out Application Documents

- Fill out the Online Application
- Read and Sign the Agreement for International Adoption Services
- Read and Sign the Social Media Policy
- Read and Sign the Complaint Procedure
- Read and Sign the "No Healthy Child Letter"
- Read and Sign the Consent to Release Confidential Information
- Read and sign the Privacy Practices
- Upload your family photo
- Pay the application fee

\*Please Note: Keep the Complaint form for your records; you may want to make a copy of the Policy & Procedure to also keep for your records.

### 2. Complete your Orientation

Once we review and accept your Application materials, we will send you an acceptance letter via email. Shortly after that you will receive an invoice for the orientation phase and then begin your orientation with your adoption advisor.

### 3. Obtain a Home Study

- If you live in Nightlight's licensed area, we will perform your home study. Once your application is approved, your adoption advisor will notify you how to get started on your home study with one of our Nightlight offices.
- If you are out of Nightlight's licensed area, we will help you find a local agency.

The cost of operating an international adoption program is substantial and increasing with the additional compliance requirements under the Hague Convention on Inter country Adoption. The nature of international adoption makes it impossible to predict the exact costs you will incur, but we believe the estimates above are realistic. Although we strive to maintain a predictable fee schedule, unexpected increase in our costs may necessitate an increase in fees. Therefore, fees may be increased upon 90 day notice. Program fees are paid in phases and are non-refundable. Nightlight establishes a budget for costs each year based on the number of adoptions it estimates completing, as well as revenue from grants and donations. Based on these estimates, we establish program fees to cover the costs of attorneys, facilitators, social workers, insurance, and other costs we incur. Of course it would be prohibitive to allocate all of the costs (payroll, rent, insurance, supplies, travel, etc) to one adoption in one program.

### A late fee of 12% annual (1% monthly) will be assessed for fees more than 30 days past due.
