Adoption Milestones of 2013

This year Nightlight has continued to create a legacy of uniting waiting children with loving families. Here are a few highlights:

Brenda and Steve are expected to be Nightlight's first family to adopt from Haiti. They will soon have their court date to adopt Didi and Dada, eleven year old twins. Nightlight received accreditation to work in three new foreign countries in 2013: Latvia, Haiti, and Kazakhstan. We now have twenty families in the process of adopting children from Haiti. Over Christmas, in partnership with Project 143, we are bringing twelve children from Latvia for an orphan host tour. We expect many of these kids will find adoptive homes as they come in contact with our wonderful adoptive families who meet them and fall in love with them.

Ken and Alina are in Romania at this moment, and they are nearing the completion of adopting their five year old daughter Mara. Over ten years ago Romania halted intercountry adoptions. But this year Nightlight became one of the first agencies to receive accreditation to process adoptions there. Adoptive families must be Romanian citizens, but there are hundreds of thousands of Romanians living among us, so we expect this to be a robust adoption program. Mara may very well be the first Romanian child adopted by an American family in this new program!

Roy and Shaundra welcomed six year old Elanna into their home as they became Nightlight's first foster/adopt family in our Colorado office. Of the 400,000 children in the US foster care program, 100,000 of these kids are immediately available for adoption. In our effort to help more kids find permanent, loving families, we have expanded our services to include foster care.

The Snowflakes® program continues to receive wide exposure in the media. Katie Couric featured the Gassman family on her ABC daytime talk show. And the largest English speaking newspaper in the world, the UK Telegraph, featured a story about Snowflakes this fall. This year our programs were also featured in World Magazine, the Orange County Register, Voice of America, and many other outlets. As a result, traffic to Nightlight's website has tripled in the last couple months! In addition, we recently celebrated the opening of our 1000th Snowflake donor family file.

Nightlight began offering a "Certificate in Openness" to domestic adoption families. This certificate involves specific training about open adoptions, and the participants commit to having an open adoption. We expect that birthmothers will have greater confidence in working with our agency, as we set ourselves apart in our commitment to pursuing lifelong healthy relationships that are in the best interest of all parties in the adoption "triad."

For eleven years Nightlight's Embryo Adoption Awareness Center has enjoyed financial support from a government grant instituted by President George Bush. The funding for that grant has diminished over time, and we were braced for a complete loss of that income. Much to our delight and surprise, however, we secured not one, but two federal grants. In fact, the Department of Health and Human Services was so convinced of our superior ability to provide these services, that we received almost 2/3 of the total funding allocated for this program.

Snowflakes often receives inquiries from people living in other countries, and has completed embryo adoptions for people from Canada, France,

India, New

This year Nightlight increased home study services for Americans living abroad. As the world gets "smaller" more US citizens are living in other countries, and as they fall in love with orphaned children they pursue adoption. Nightlight is willing to send social workers to these foreign countries to complete the education and investigation for the home study. This year Rhonda Jarema completed two home studies in Haiti.




Financial Information

Thanks in large part to your financial help, Nightlight has been able to serve over a hundred families this year. Below is a graph explaining where our revenue comes from, excluding grant income and matching expenses. You can see below that only 63% of our revenue came from adoption fees, which means we are **dependent upon donations to help subsidize the costs**. Thanks to your generous ongoing support, we are able to help more families adopt by making it a little more affordable.




People often wonder why adoption is so expensive and whether Nightlight is able to lower the fees. As you can see in the next chart, 17% of our expenses are paid directly to other companies, organizations, or governments as a part of the adoption. Nightlight incurs these costs with each adoption, so a large portion of the fees we collect are not retained as operating expenses. The majority of our remaining fees are for the salaries of our 29 staff members who work tirelessly to complete adoptions.



Nightlight Christian Adoptions is blessed to have connected thousands of children with loving parents for fifty-four years. Below are some statistics for our adoptions in each program. Because international adoptions are the most costly, they have declined nationwide since the economic crash a few years ago. But there is a new wave of momentum, fueled by compassion and awareness. Many of these new applicants do not have the ability to finance adoption alone, and it has become very common for them to ask friends and family to donate through online fundraising campaigns.

Our journey together started much like that of your older brothers. First, we wanted you. Well, it wasn't you yet, but it was the thought of a child. Then you were there! Just as a baby grew in my belly, we grew to know you slowly. First it was a photo. We smiled when we looked at it, and wondered about your personality and laugh. We dreamed about being together and what you would sound like, what will interest you? Then like seeing the first movement on a sonogram screen, dad found a video of you on YouTube! Joy filled our heart when we heard your voice! Little pieces of you were coming together for us, and we fell in love even more!

We filled many hours talking about you, thought about your hopes and dreams, what you would think is silly in our house and would make you laugh. It seemed like forever waiting for the call that we could move forward to meet you. Each step was an eternity, but we spent the time in wonderment, looking at your photo and video over and over, lovingly anticipating the first time we see you in real life. Endlessly we talked about you, wanting you to be happy in your new life, just like we did with your brothers.

It didn't take nine months and morning sickness (thankfully!) to meet you. You weren't a wiggly little pink baby. You are a beautiful young girl that we caught a glimpse of across a school cafeteria. We weren't suppose to get to see you, but there you were, in your Aero sweatshirt. We couldn't take our eyes off you, though we had to pretend to be looking around so as not to be so obvious! You weren't suppose to know about us yet. We had known about you for months. Everyone needed to know that we were sure and secure in bringing you to our home. You couldn't be hurt, it wouldn't be right, so we had to know in our hearts and let everyone know we were

certain. It was easy to be sure, because from the time we learned about you, you settled softly into our hearts. We protected and loved you the only way we knew how, through prayers and blowing kisses into the wind at night.

The day after we met the people who love and care for you; Tracy, Chelsea, Jeanna and your foster mom, we were allowed to tell them if we wanted you in our lives. DUH! Both dad and I couldn't sleep that morning, waking up early and anxious to finally be allowed to say YES! I thought dad wrote them the most beautiful message: "Angel is a very special, precious young lady. Kate and I are humbled and honored by your trust in us to give us this opportunity to provide Angel her forever family." I gently begged them to hurry and bring you the family photo album we made you and let you in on the fact that you were being very loved somewhere! We knew after that we'd finally be able to meet you. But it is kind of sad for me too, because I know it will not happen as quickly as I want. I want to know you now, to hug you and let you know you are safe, loved and cherished. But I trust God's timing. And we have a whole lifetime that we can build together! There is so much to be thankful for!

Then I went on the Colorado Heart Gallery to look at your picture and video, as I have done every night. And the smallest little thing made me smile with such a special warmth inside. Your picture now has a little heart beside it. I knew what that meant... that it is finally becoming real! When I clicked on your picture, there was that little heart again, with a note beside it that I knew so well, "I've been placed with my forever family." I had dreamed of seeing your photo with that little heart and having you with us... I didn't expect the world to know before you did! But it gave me great joy, I quickly took a picture of the computer screen and made it my phone's wallpaper. It may take a while to meet you, but nothing is stopping us now!

People say that when you adopt, a hole is filled that you didn't know existed. While I love this sentiment, the more I think about it the more I feel there is more to it than that. Thinking about this I realized that what we're doing is adding a pocket to the beautiful family fabric we've been weaving, another pocket of love! I don't know who said it, but when you love someone new, love is not divided, it is multiplied. So very true!
