Samoa



GENERAL INFORMATION

Samoa, located in the region of the South Pacific known as Polynesia, is an island nation in the South Pacific Ocean. Samoa is roughly midway between Fiji and New Zealand. The islands have narrow coastal plains with volcanic, rocky, rugged mountains in the interior. The two main islands of Samoa are Upolu and Savaii. The capital, Apia, and the international airport are on Upolu. The official languages are Samoan and English. Samoan is the native language of most of the population. English is widely understood and spoken in the capital of Apia as well as many tourist resorts; however, it is less commonly understood in the villages.

All adoptions in Samoa are completed through a collaborative effort with a Samoan attorney, the Samoan Victim Support Group (SVSG) Samoa's Attorney General and the Family Court of Samoa who handle international adoptions and orphan care in Samoa.

CHILDREN AVAILABLE

- Samoan children from infancy to teens are available for adoption.
- Children available are of Polynesian (Pacific Islander) descent.
- Both boys and girls are available and gender preference may be specified.
- Sibling groups are available.
- Children with special needs are available.

ELIGIBILITY TO ADOPT

Married couples and singles may adopt from Samoa. Married couples must be between 23-55 years of age. Singles must be at least 24 years old at the time of the I-600A filing and 25 years old at the time of the I-600 filing. Applicants must be in good health, show financial stability and the ability to provide financially and emotionally for a child through adulthood.

PROCESS

- 1. Submit application to Nightlight Christian Adoptions
- 2. Complete your adoption home study and submit form I-600A to USCIS.
- 3. Begin to assemble your **dossier**. We will give you detailed instructions.
- 4. Once USCIS has approved you to adopt from Samoa, you will receive your I-171H approval notice.
- 5. Once your USCIS approval has been received and your dossier is complete, your dossier is sent to Samoa and your name added to the waitlist to be matched with a child. Current approximate wait times to be matched with a child are anticipated to be 24 48 months and are dependent on the characteristics of child you are hoping to adopt and the children eligible for adoption at the time you are placed on the wait list.
- 6. Complete official referral review with Nightlight's Social Services Department
- 7. Upon referral acceptance, NCA will assist you with updating your dossier if needed and processing of your Court adoption petition.
- 8. You will complete the Court legal process and Attorney General approval process, which generally takes 9 12 months to complete.
- 9. Upon Court approval of your adoption, the attorney in Samoa will obtain your child's post-adoption birth certificate, Samoan passport and for U.S. families your child's New Zealand travel visa.
- 10. Upon completion of your legal adoption process in Samoa, NCA will assist with filing your form I600.
- 11. Upon provisional approval of U.S. form I600, your file is sent to the U.S. Embassy in Auckland, New Zealand for visa processing.
- 12. Once your child's visa is approved by the U.S. embassy, you will travel to Apia Samoa to meet your child, then onto Auckland New Zealand for visa medicals and final visa processing.
- 13. Once your child's visa is received you travel home with your child!

- 14. The children reside at the SVSG shelter while waiting adoption.
- 15. Samoa adoptions can take on average from 30 60 months to complete from dossier submission.

TRAVEL & ADOPTION

You receive a proposed match of a child from Nightlight Christian Adoptions in collaboration with SVSG. The child's documents will include a medical examination of the child, a photo of the child, applicable consents and legal paperwork and any available known history. We highly recommend that you have this information reviewed by a doctor who specializes in international adoption before you make a decision. Once you decide to accept the proposed match, you will be considered "matched" with the child. You will then wait to complete the legal adoption process in Samoa, apply for the child's visa, then wait for an invitation to travel to Samoa to bring your child home. Most families invited to travel will receive approximately a four week notice prior to travel. When you are invited to travel, you will know the date of your embassy visa appointment (U.S. families). U.S families travel to Samoa to be united with their child(ren), and then travel to Auckland, New Zealand to attend the child's visa medical appointment, the embassy appointment, and receive the child's Orphan Visa.


POST ADOPTION

Within 30 days of your arrival home, you must have a home visit by your home study provider. Your home study provider will prepare a full postadoption reports and submit them to Nightlight Christian Adoptions at 6 months, 12 months, and 24 months from the date of placement and pictures of the child with family, every three months for the first year e-mailed to the parents' program director. Reports include your child's developmental progress and pictures. This is a very serious commitment; Nightlight Christian Adoptions is committed to showing the Samoan Government and birth families that children adopted by US citizens are healthy and well cared for. Compliance with post adoption reports is also required by the U.S. Department of State. Therefore, Nightlight charges a fee to monitor and process these post placement reports and also requires families to pay for the cost of the post placement report in advance.

COSTS

The program fee for a Samoa adoption is \$31,700. Your additional costs will include home study, USCIS approval, notary & apostille fees, airfare, hotel, in country guide, and embassy fees as shown on the fee schedule. Your out-of-pocket expenses may further be reduced if you receive scholarships, grants or employer-provided adoption benefits. For additional fee information please see Exhibit A.

1. Fill out Application Documents

- Fill out the Online Application
- Read and Sign the Agreement for International Adoption Services
- Read and Sign the Social Media Policy
- Read and Sign the Complaint Procedure
- Read and Sign the "No Healthy Child Letter"
- Read and Sign the Consent to Release Confidential Information
- Read and sign the Privacy Practices
- Upload your family photo
- Pay the application fee

*Please Note: Keep the Complaint form for your records; you may want to make a copy of the Policy & Procedure to also keep for your records.

2. Complete your Orientation

Once we review and accept your Application materials, we will send you an acceptance letter via email. Shortly after that you will receive an invoice for the orientation phase and then begin your orientation with your adoption advisor.

3. Obtain a Home Study

- If you live in Nightlight's licensed area, we will perform your home study. Once your application is approved, your adoption advisor will notify you how to get started on your home study with one of our Nightlight offices.
- If you are out of Nightlight's licensed area, we will help you find a local agency.

The cost of operating an international adoption program is substantial and increasing with the additional compliance requirements under The Hague Convention on Inter-Country Adoption. The nature of international adoption makes it impossible to predict the exact costs you will incur, but we believe the estimates above are realistic. Although we strive to maintain a predictable fee schedule, unexpected increase in our costs may necessitate an increase in fees. Therefore, fees may be increased upon 90-day notice.

Program fees are paid in phases and are non-refundable. Nightlight establishes a budget for costs each year based on the number of adoptions it estimates completing, as well as revenue from grants and donations. Based on these estimates, we establish program fees to cover the costs of attorneys, facilitators, social workers, insurance, and other costs we incur. Of course it would be prohibitive to allocate all of the costs (payroll, rent, insurance, supplies, travel, etc.) to one adoption in one program.

A late fee of 12% annual (1% monthly) will be assessed for fees more than 30 days past due.
