GENERAL INFORMATION

The United Kingdom is a Hague Convention Country. Adoptive placements from the UK primarily kinship adoptions, with children in the UK foster care system. We have worked with the local adoption authorities and UK Central Authority to help place children with aunts and uncles, grandparents and cousins over the past few years. The Local Authority may consider other close family relationships, for permanent placement with children in foster care. Nightlight estimates the UK adoption process will take around 24 months from application to completion, depending on issues related to the family situation. The adoption process is typically initiated by the Local Authority or foster care program in the UK.

CHILDREN AVAILABLE

- Boys and girls
- Babies through children under 16 years of age.
- Sibling groups
- The child or children must be a biological relative, available for adoption, meeting the 'orphan' definition.

ELIGIBILITY TO ADOPT

- Married couples and single individuals
- Applicants must be at least 25 years of age
- At least 18 years age difference between prospective adoptive parents and the adopted child.
- Biological relative of the intended adoptee. The Local Authority may consider a non-biological family member, if it is in the child's best interests.

PROCESS

- 1. Complete our online application and orientation, once your application is accepted.
- 2. Begin your Home Study at one of the Nightlight offices if you reside in a state, where Nightlight has an office. Otherwise you will be provided with affiliated home study provider agencies.
- 3. After your Home Study is complete, it will be reviewed by Nightlight. You will then submit the I-800A packet to USCIS.
- 4. Once the I-800A receives provisional approval by USCIS, Nightlight will work with the Council to arrange for the 10-week bonding period.
- 5. The Prospective parents will travel to the UK to begin the transition period and initial bonding with the child. The child will then travel with the prospective parents and likely the child's social worker, to the US. The UK worker will then assist with transition at the family home.
- 6. The required bonding period is for a minimum of ten-weeks, however due to USCIS processing times, tends to run closer to 6-9 months. Once the child is placed with the prospective family during the bonding period, the child remains with the family through the finalization of the adoption.
- 7. Nightlight will work together with the UK Council to gather the necessary documents for the I-800.
- 8. The UK Council will provide the Child medical, social and psychological reports. The Article 16 letter will come from the UK Central Authority and will accompany the Article 16 report.
- 9. Complete official referral review with Nightlight's Social Services Department
 We will instruct you in filing the I-800 with Immigration and you will receive a provisional approval to adopt your child.

- 10. After the approval from Immigration, the parents and child will return to the UK to complete the adoption. Typically, this trip is from 1-3 weeks, and includes the finalization of the adoption in the UK court, filing of the adoption paperwork and obtaining the US Immigrant VISA to return to the US.
- 11. The UK Council will assist you with the embassy appointment.
- 12. Once you arrive home, you will notify Nightlight.

TRAVEL & ADOPTION

- Typically, there is an initial visit to the UK to verify the family commitment to the adoption. This often takes place
 once the family has an approved home study. Once the family has the approved I-800A, they will begin working
 with the UK Council towards transitioning the child to the family in the US.
- Either the pre-adoptive family or the child social worker will transport the child to the US for the 10-week bonding period. Some portion of this time may be required to be completed in the UK.
- The Final trip is for the court hearing to complete the adoption. Only one parent needs to come although it is recommended that the entire family participate. You will file your child's adoption paperwork at the U.S. Embassy and obtain the child's U.S. Immigrant visa. Upon arriving back in the U.S. your child will automatically be a U.S. citizen. A few weeks after arriving home, your child will receive a Certificate of Citizenship.

POST ADOPTION

Each Local Authority or Council in the UK, will determine the frequency and specific requirements for the post adoption reporting. Often, the visits and reports are completed by both the UK Social Worker as well as the US home study provider, weekly through the first month and then one or two visits monthly. The post placement reporting will continue through the finalization of the adoption in the UK.

COSTS

The program fee for an adoption from the UK is \$8,600. Your additional costs will include home study, post placement, post adoption, immigration fees, country attorney, travel, documents or communication. In most cases, the UK Council will cover the majority, if not all of the expenses. Any fees not covered by the Council will be negotiated between the family and Local Authority with guidance from Nightlight. - Read and Sign the "No Healthy Child Letter"
- Read and Sign the Consent to Release Confidential Information
- Read and sign the Privacy Practices
- Upload your family photo
- Pay the application fee

*Please Note: Keep the Complaint form for your records; you may want to make a copy of the Policy & Procedure to also keep for your records.

2. Complete your Orientation

Once we review and accept your Application materials, we will send you an acceptance letter via e-mail. Shortly after that you will receive an invoice for the orientation phase and then begin your orientation with your adoption advisor.

3. Obtain a Home Study

- If you live in Nightlight's licensed area, we will perform your home study. Once your application is approved, your adoption advisor will notify you how to get started on your home study with one of our Nightlight offices.
- If you are out of Nightlight's licensed area, we will help you find a local agency.

The cost of operating an international adoption program is substantial and increasing with the additional compliance requirements under the Hague Convention on Intercountry Adoption. The nature of international adoption makes it impossible to predict the exact costs you will incur, but we believe the estimates above are realistic. Although we strive to maintain a predictable fee schedule, unexpected increase in our costs may necessitate an increase in fees. Therefore, fees may be increased upon 90 day notice. Program fees are paid in phases and are non-refundable. Nightlight establishes a budget for costs each year based on the number of adoptions it estimates completing, as well as revenue from grants and donations. Based on these estimates, we establish program fees to cover the costs of attorneys, facilitators, social workers, insurance, and other costs we incur. Of course it would be prohibitive to allocate all of the costs (payroll, rent, insurance, supplies, travel, etc) to one adoption in one program.
