Colombia



GENERAL INFORMATION

Colombia is a country at the northern tip of South America. Its landscape is marked by rainforests, Andes mountains and numerous coffee plantations. It is the third most populous country in South America. In the high- altitude capital, Bogotá, the Zona Rosa district is known for its restaurants and shops and is a pleasure to visit among tourists. Colombia has a tropical temperate climate with little seasonal variation. The Hispanic culture is warm and friendly. There is a domestic adoption program available to Colombian citizens – these families generally get preference in child placement before foreign adopters.

Colombia is party to The Hague Convention on Protection of Children and Co-operation in Respect of Intercountry Adoption (Hague Adoption Convention). Therefore, all intercountry adoptions between Colombia and the United States must meet the requirements of the Convention and U.S. law implementing the Convention. Colombian adoptions are conducted through a collaborative effort of a Hague accredited adoption agency in the U.S. and by the Colombian Central Adoption Authority (ICBF).

CHILDREN AVAILABLE

Single children above age 10, sibling groups (one child is above age 10), and children of all ages with various special needs are available.

ELIGIBILITY TO ADOPT

- Parents age 25 to 55 years can adopt special needs children age 0-5. Parents age 56 to 59 can adopt special needs children age 6 to 9.
- At least one parent has to be over 25 years of age.
- Single women and men are accepted into the program.
- A couple has to be married for at least 2 years.

REFERRALS

Referrals are provided by ICBF in Colombia. The referral will contain basic information on child's medical and social background and pictures. Referral time depends on the profiles of the child(ren) a family looks to adopt. Referrals for families who have hosted a child who proceeds to adoption will be expedited.

PROCESS

1. Make application to Nightlight Christian Adoptions.
2. Begin your **adoption home study** and submit **form I-800A** to CIS.
3. Begin to assemble your **dossier**. We will give you detailed instructions.
4. Once USCIS has approved your adoption home study, you will receive your **I-797C pre-approval notice**.

5. Once your USCIS approval has been received your dossier is complete, you will be registered to adopt in Colombia.
6. The Colombian Central Authority will add you to a list of waiting families and it can take 6 to 12 months to receive a referral.
7. Complete official referral review with Nightlight's Social Services Department
8. Upon referral acceptance, Nightlight will begin processing the family's I-800.
9. You will then travel to Colombia for the required 9-day integration period and then remain in country for the court adoption process.
10. Once you have received the adoption decree, the attorney will obtain a new birth certificate and passport for your child.
11. The final step is to obtain the US visa for your child and returning home. Most families will remain in Colombia for 3-6 weeks for the adoption process to be completed.
12. The children reside in orphanages while awaiting adoption.
13. Colombia adoptions can take on average from 9 to 24 months to complete. Families host a child from Colombia have expedited adoptions.

TRAVEL

Only 1 trip is required for adoption from Colombia. Once you are in country, you will meet your child and he/she will be with you for the duration of your stay. The first 9 days with your child is considered an "integration period." Then adoption will be finalized while you are in country. This takes approximately 4-6 weeks. A new birth certificate and passport will be issued. After an exit interview with the US Embassy you will be able to leave the country with your child(ren).

POST ADOPTION

Within 30 days of your arrival home, you must have a home visit by your home study provider. Your home study provider will prepare post-adoption reports and submit them to Nightlight. For single children under age 8, reports are due at 6, 12, 18 and 24 months after your adoption finalization date. For children over the age of 8 and siblings, reports are due at 6, 12, 18, 24, 30 and 36 months after your adoption finalization date. These reports include your child's developmental progress and pictures. This is a very serious commitment. Compliance with post adoption reports is also required by The Hague Convention. Therefore, Nightlight charges a fee to monitor and process these post placement reports and also requires families to pay for the cost of the post placement report in advance

COSTS

The agency program fees as well as other fees both in the US and in country for a Colombia adoption are listed below. Your out-of-pocket expenses may further be reduced if you receive scholarships, grants or employer-provided adoption benefits. For additional fee information please see Exhibit A.

Getting Started CHECKLIST

1. Fill out Application Documents

- Fill out the Online Application
- Read and Sign the Agreement for International Adoption Services
- Read and Sign the Social Media Policy
- Read and Sign the Complaint Procedure
- Read and Sign the “No Healthy Child Letter”
- Read and Sign the Consent to Release Confidential Information
- Read and sign the Privacy Practices
- Upload your family photo
- Pay the application fee

**Please Note: Keep the Complaint form for your records; you may want to make a copy of the Policy & Procedure to also keep for your records.*

2. Complete your Orientation

Once we review and accept your Application materials, we will send you an acceptance letter via e-mail. Shortly after that you will receive an invoice for the orientation phase and then begin your orientation with your adoption advisor.

3. Obtain a Home Study

- **If you live in Nightlight’s licensed area**, we will perform your home study. Once your application is approved, your adoption advisor will notify you how to get started on your home study with one of our Nightlight offices.
- **If you are out of Nightlight’s licensed area**, we will help you find a local agency.

The cost of operating an international adoption program is substantial and increasing with the additional compliance requirements under The Hague Convention on Inter-Country Adoption. The nature of international adoption makes it impossible to predict the exact costs you will incur, but we believe the estimates above are realistic. Although we strive to maintain a predictable fee schedule, unexpected increase in our costs may necessitate an increase in fees. Therefore, fees may be increased upon 90-day notice.

Program fees are paid in phases and are non-refundable. Nightlight establishes a budget for costs each year based on the number of adoptions it estimates completing, as well as revenue from grants and donations. Based on these estimates, we establish program fees to cover the costs of attorneys, facilitators, social workers, insurance, and other costs we incur. Of course it would be prohibitive to allocate all of the costs (payroll, rent, insurance, supplies, travel, etc) to one adoption in one program.

A late fee of 12% annual (1% monthly) will be assessed for fees more than 30 days past due.
