

Nightlight® Christian Adoptions International Adoption Program Description Georgia

GENERAL INFORMATION

The ancient and historically significant country of Georgia borders Armenia, Azerbaijan, Russia and Turkey. The climate is similar to the southeastern section of the United States. The terrain is mountainous and often lush, as evidenced by the beautiful sea sides and stunning views from every city vista. Georgia is the second nation to adopt Christianity as the national faith. More than half of the Georgian population lives in cities, including in the capital Tbilisi. Georgia is party to The Hague Convention on Protection of Children and Co-operation in Respect of Intercountry Adoption (Hague Adoption Convention). Therefore, all intercountry adoptions between Georgia and the United States must meet the requirements of the Convention as well as Georgian and U.S. law implementing the Convention.

Adoptions from Georgia are conducted through a collaborative effort of a Hague accredited primary adoption service provider in the US and by the Georgian Central Adoption Authority (LEPL Agency For State Care and Assistance for the (Statutory) Victims of Human Trafficking (Ministry of Internally Displaced Persons From The Occupied Territories, Labor, Health and Social Affairs).

- Children of either gender from toddler to teen are eligible for intercountry adoption.
- Sibling groups are rarely cleared for intercountry adoption.
- Most eligible children have known medical and/or developmental diagnoses, typically moderate to non-correctable.

ELIGIBILITY TO ADOPT

Married couples and single women are eligible. A minimum age difference between prospective adoptive parents and a child of 18 years is required as is a maximum age difference of 49 years, unless an exception is made in the best interest of the child. Applicants must not have a criminal record or substance abuse history.

PROCESS

- 1. Make application to Nightlight Christian Adoptions.
- 2. Complete your adoption home study and submit form I-800A to USCIS.
- 3. Begin to assemble your **dossier**. We will give you detailed instructions.
- 4. Once USCIS has approved your application, you will receive your I-797C pre-approval notice.
- 5. When your dossier is complete, it is shipped to Georgia and you will be registered to adopt.
- 6. The referral wait time is unpredictable and varies depending on a family's specific child request.
- 7. Issuance of a referral by Georgia's Central Adoption Authority.
- 8. Complete the official referral review with Nightlight's Social Services Department.
- 9. Upon referral acceptance, Nightlight will begin processing the family's I-800.
- 10. Once the I-800 is approved and the US embassy in Tbilisi has issued the Article 5 letter, a family will be invited to meet the child and undergo the court and US visa processes. This single trip takes about three weeks and both parents must travel.

TRAVEL & ADOPTION

A referral from Georgia will include a brief social and medical history of the child, and the current health and development of the child.

We highly recommend that you have this information reviewed by a doctor who specializes in international adoption before you decide to proceed. You will complete a referral review with a Nightlight staff member before accepting the referral. If accepting the referral, Nightlight will assist you in filing your I-800 and obtaining your National Visa Center numbers for issuance of the Article 5 Letter by the US Embassy. Upon arrival in Georgia, you will have the opportunity to meet the child and spend time getting to know one another ahead of the previously scheduled court date. The court will issue a full and final adoption decree. Families are then assisted in obtaining the child's passport and wait for official translations of all post-adoption documents. When all documents necessary for the visa interview have been secured, the appointment at the US embassy takes place and the child's visa should be issued within a few days. Families can now return to the US with their new child.

POST ADOPTION

Within 30 days of your arrival home, you must have a home visit by your home study provider. Georgia requires five post-adoption reports at 6 months, 12 months, 18 months, 24 months, and 36 months after the adoption is finalized. These reports include information about your child's health, developmental progress, and pictures. All reports must be social worker generated, notarized and apostilled. Georgia's Central Adoption Authority reserves the right to request family generated reports until the child turns 18. Nightlight is committed to showing the Georgian Central Adoption Authority that children adopted by US citizens are healthy and well care for by sending all required reports in a timely manner. Compliance with post adoption reports is also required by The Hague Convention.

COSTS

The program fee for a Georgia adoption is \$25,250. Your additional costs will include home study, USCIS approval, notary & apostille fees, airfare, hotel, in country guide, and embassy fees as shown on the fee schedule. Your out-of-pocket expenses may further be reduced if you receive scholarships, grants or employer-provided adoption benefits. For additional fee information please see Exhibit A.

Getting Started CHECKLIST

1. Fill out Application Documents

- Fill out the Online Application
- Read and Sign the Agreement for International Adoption Services
- Read and Sign the Social Media Policy
- Read and Sign the Complaint Procedure
- Read and Sign the "No Healthy Child Letter"
- Read and Sign the Consent to Release Confidential Information
- Read and sign the Privacy Practices
- Upload your family photo
- Pay the application fee

2. Complete your Orientation

Once we review and accept your Application materials, we will send you an acceptance letter via e-mail. Shortly after that you will receive an invoice for the orientation phase and then begin your orientation with your adoption advisor.

3. Obtain a Home Study

- If you live in Nightlight's licensed area, we will perform your home study. Once your application is approved, your adoption advisor will notify you how to get started on your home study with one of our Nightlight offices.
- If you are out of Nightlight's licensed area, we will help you find a local agency.

The cost of operating an international adoption program is substantial and increasing with the additional compliance requirements under the Hague Convention on Intercountry Adoption. The nature of international adoption makes it impossible to predict the exact costs you will incur, but we believe the estimates above are realistic. Although we strive to maintain a predictable fee schedule, unexpected increase in our costs may necessitate an increase in fees. Therefore, fees may be increased upon 90 day notice.

Program fees are paid in phases and are non-refundable. Nightlight establishes a budget for costs each year based on the number of adoptions it estimates completing, as well as revenue from grants and donations. Based on these estimates, we establish program fees to cover the costs of attorneys, facilitators, social workers, insurance, and other costs we incur. Of course it would be prohibitive to allocate all of the costs (payroll, rent, insurance, supplies, travel, etc) to one adoption in one program.

A late fee of 12% annual (1% monthly) will be assessed for fees more than 30 days past due.
