Ecuador



GENERAL INFORMATION

Ecuador is a country located on the coast of the Pacific Ocean in South America. It also includes the Galapagos Islands. It is considered one of 17 megadiverse countries in the world. It is a representative democratic republic and a developing country. Ecuador has a tropical temperate climate with little seasonal variation. The Hispanic culture is warm and friendly. There is a domestic adoption program available to Ecuadorian citizens – these families generally get preference in child placement before foreign adopters.

Ecuador is party to The Hague Convention on Protection of Children and Co-operation in Respect of Intercountry Adoption (Hague Adoption Convention). Therefore, all intercountry adoptions between Ecuador and the United States must meet the requirements of the Convention and U.S. law implementing the Convention. Ecuadorian adoptions are conducted through a collaborative effort of a Hague accredited adoption agency in the U.S. and by the Ecuadorian Central Adoption Authority (Autoridad Central de Adopciones Internacionales del Ecuador).

CHILDREN AVAILABLE

Single children who are school age and older, sibling groups, and children who are younger with more complex medical needs.

ELIGIBILITY TO ADOPT

- Parents age 25 to 51 can adopt. There must be at least 15 years and no more than 45 years between the youngest parent and the child being adopted.
- Single women are accepted into the program.
- A couple has to be married for at least 3 years.
- They expect parents to have some basic Spanish skills.

REFERRALS

Referrals are provided by the central authority in Ecuador. The referral will contain basic information on child's medical and social background. Referral time depends on the profiles of the child(ren) a family looks to adopt.

PROCESS

- 1. Make application to Nightlight Christian Adoptions.
- 2. Begin your adoption home study and submit form I-800A to USCIS.
- 3. Begin to assemble your **dossier**. We will give you detailed instructions.
- 4. Once USCIS has approved your adoption home study, you will receive your I-797C pre-approval notice.

- 5. Once your USCIS approval has been received your dossier is complete, you will be registered to adopt in Ecuador.
- 6. The Ecuadorian Central Authority will add you to a list of waiting families and you will then wait for a referral.
- 7. Complete official referral review with Nightlight's Social Services Department
- 8. Upon referral acceptance, you will file your I-800.
- 9. You will then travel to Ecuador for approximately 8-10 weeks
- 10. Once you have received the adoption decree, the attorney will obtain a new birth certificate and passport for your child.
- 11. The final step is to obtain the US visa for your child and returning home.
- 12. The children reside in orphanages while awaiting adoption.
- 13. Ecuador adoptions can take on average 9 to 24 months to complete.

TRAVEL

Only 1 trip is required for adoption from Ecuador. Once you are in country, you will meet your child and he/she will be with you for the duration of your stay. The first week with your child will be a bonding period. Then the adoption will be finalized while you are in country. A new birth certificate and passport will be issued. After an exit interview with the US Embassy you will be able to leave the country with your child(ren). You can estimate that you will be in country for about 8-10 weeks.

POST ADOPTION

Within 30 days of your arrival home, you must have a home visit by your home study provider. Your home study provider will prepare post-adoption reports and submit them to Nightlight. The rest of your reports are due at 4, 8, 12, 18, and 24 months after your adoption finalization date. These reports include your child's developmental progress and pictures. This is a very serious commitment. Compliance with post adoption reports is also required by The Hague Convention. Therefore, Nightlight charges a fee to monitor and process these post placement reports and also requires families to pay for the cost of the post placement report in advance.

COSTS

The agency program fees as well as other fees both in the US and in country for an Ecuador adoption are listed below. Your out-of-pocket expenses may further be reduced if you receive scholarships, grants or employer-provided adoption benefits. For additional fee information please see Exhibit A.

- Read and Sign the Social Media Policy
- Read and Sign the Complaint Procedure
- Read and Sign the "No Healthy Child Letter"
- Read and Sign the Consent to Release Confidential Information
- Read and sign the Privacy Practices
- Upload your family photo
- Pay the application fee

2. Complete your Orientation

Once we review and accept your Application materials, we will send you an acceptance letter via e-mail. Shortly after that you will receive an invoice for the orientation phase and then begin your orientation with your adoption advisor.

3. Obtain a Home Study

- If you live in Nightlight's licensed area, we will perform your home study. Once your application is approved, your adoption advisor will notify you how to get started on your home study with one of our Nightlight offices.
- If you are out of Nightlight's licensed area, we will help you find a local agency.

The cost of operating an international adoption program is substantial and increasing with the additional compliance requirements under The Hague Convention on Inter-

Country Adoption. The nature of international adoption makes it impossible to predict the exact costs you will incur, but we believe the estimates above are realistic. Although we strive to maintain a predictable fee schedule, unexpected increase in our costs may necessitate an increase in fees. Therefore, fees may be increased upon 90-day notice.

Program fees are paid in phases and are non-refundable. Nightlight establishes a budget for costs each year based on the number of adoptions it estimates completing, as well as revenue from grants and donations. Based on these estimates, we establish program fees to cover the costs of attorneys, facilitators, social workers, insurance, and other costs we incur. Of course it would be prohibitive to allocate all of the costs (payroll, rent, insurance, supplies, travel, etc) to one adoption in one program.

A late fee of 12% annual (1% monthly) will be assessed for fees more than 30 days past due.
