Haiti



GENERAL INFORMATION

Haiti is located on the island of Hispaniola in the Caribbean Sea. It shares a border with the Dominican Republic. With over 10.6 million people, it is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. With a history of civil unrest, brutal dictators and, natural disasters, it is a country with a weak infrastructure robbed of natural resources. The culture is rich in art, music and food with pockets of luxury tourist accommodations – a stark difference from the country's capital Port-au-Prince.

Haiti is party to The Hague Convention on Protection of Children and Co-operation in Respect of Intercountry Adoption (Hague Adoption Convention). Therefore, all intercountry adoptions between Haiti and the United States must meet the requirements of the Convention and U.S. law implementing the Convention. Haitian adoptions are conducted through a collaborative effort of a Hague accredited adoption agency in the U.S. and by the Haitian Central Adoption Authority (IBESR).

CHILDREN AVAILABLE

Children and sibling groups of all ages are available for adoption from Haiti. We are currently only taking applications of families that are open to children ages 6+.

ELIGIBILITY TO ADOPT

- At least one parent has to be over 30 years of age. Neither parent can be over age 50.
- Single women are accepted into the program.
- A couple has to be married for at least 5 years.

REFERRALS

Referrals are provided by Haiti. The referral will contain basic information on child's medical and social background and pictures. Referral wait times are based off of the age of child that you are open to and approved for which are below:

- Child 6-7 years: average referral time is 2+ years
- Child 8+ average referral time is less than 2 years
- Sibling groups: average referral time is less than 2 years

PROCESS

- 1. Make application to Nightlight Christian Adoptions.
- 2. Begin your adoption home study and submit form I-800A to USCIS.
- 3. Begin to assemble your **dossier**. We will give you detailed instructions.
- 4. Once USCIS has approved your adoption home study, you will receive your I-797C pre-approval notice.
- 5. Once your USCIS approval has been received your dossier is complete, you will be registered to adopt in Haiti.
- 6. The Haitian Central Authority will add you to a list of waiting families and it can take several years to receive a referral.

- 7. Complete official referral review with Nightlight's Social Services Department
- 8. Upon referral acceptance, you will travel to Haiti for a 15-day bonding trip.
- 9. Upon return to the US, you will file your I-800 application.
- 10. Once you receive your I-800 provisional approval, your dossier goes to court for the adoption.
- 11. Once you have received the court decree, the attorney will obtain a new birth certificate and passport for your child.
- 12. The final step is to obtain the US visa for your child. Once the visa is printed, you go to Haiti for the second required trip of 6 days and then return home with your child.
- 13. The children reside in orphanages while awaiting adoption.
- 14. It can take 12-14 months to bring your child home once you are matched.

TRAVEL

Only two trips are required for adoption from Haiti. The first trip is 15 days and you will meet the child you were referred. Both parents are required to attend this trip. You will go on your second trip after adoption in Haiti is completed and your child's visa is obtained. The required stay for the second trip is 6 days.

POST ADOPTION

Within 30 days of your arrival home, you must have a home visit by your home study provider. Your home study provider will prepare post-adoption reports and submit them to Nightlight at 6 months, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, years after your homecoming date. These reports include your child's developmental progress and pictures. This is a very serious commitment; Nightlight is committed to showing the Haitian Central Authority of Adoption (IBESR) that children adopted by US citizens are healthy and well cared for. The Hague Convention also requires compliance with post adoption reports. Therefore, Nightlight charges a fee to monitor and process these post placement reports and requires families to pay for the cost of the post placement report in advance.

COSTS

The program fee for Haiti is \$26,000. Your additional costs will include home study, airfare, hotel, meals and embassy fees as shown on the current Program Fee Schedule.

1. Fill out Application Documents

- Fill out the Online Application
- Read and Sign the Agreement for International Adoption Services
- Read and Sign the Social Media Policy
- Read and Sign the Complaint Procedure
- Read and Sign the "No Healthy Child Letter"
- Read and Sign the Consent to Release Confidential Information
- Read and sign the Privacy Practices
- Upload your family photo
- Pay the application fee

2. Complete your Orientation

Once we review and accept your Application materials, we will send you an acceptance letter via e-mail. Shortly after that you will receive an invoice for the orientation phase and then begin your orientation with your adoption advisor.

3. Obtain a Home Study

- If you live in Nightlight's licensed area, we will perform your home study. Once your application is approved, your adoption advisor will notify you how to get started on your home study with one of our Nightlight offices.
- If you are out of Nightlight's licensed area, we will help you find a local agency.

The cost of operating an international adoption program is substantial and increasing with the additional compliance requirements under the Hague Convention on Intercountry Adoption. The nature of international adoption makes it impossible to predict the exact costs you will incur, but we believe the estimates above are realistic. Although we strive to maintain a predictable fee schedule, unexpected increase in our costs may necessitate an increase in fees. Therefore, fees may be increased upon 90 day notice. Program fees are paid in phases and are non-refundable. Nightlight establishes a budget for costs each year based on the number of adoptions it estimates completing, as well as revenue from grants and donations. Based on these estimates, we establish program fees to cover the costs of attorneys, facilitators, social workers, insurance, and other costs we incur. Of course it would be prohibitive to allocate all of the costs (payroll, rent, insurance, supplies, travel, etc) to one adoption in one program.

A late fee of 12% annual (1% monthly) will be assessed for fees more than 30 days past due.
